



Assistant Minister Vacancy

We are a reformed, confessional, evangelical church in the centre of Salisbury, seeking to proclaim *"All of Christ for All of Salisbury"*. Our church family is a warm, welcoming community of believers and our wish, God willing, is to appoint an Assistant Minister to work alongside our Senior Minister and the eldership, in furthering the cause of Christ in our city and discipling our church family members. We are therefore delighted to invite applications for this position, in which the appointee will work with his fellow elders to:

- Equip the church family in the outworking of our vision, fulfilling Christ's mandate to "go and make disciples".
- Model in word and action a lifestyle commensurate with biblical teaching and in accord with the culture, values and vision of CCS.
- Identify and develop the gifting and skills of church family members commensurate with "every member ministry".
- Forge mutual partnerships with individuals, churches, denominations and organizations that share our values and vision.

Personal responsibilities in the areas of Word Ministry, Worship, Evangelism and Pastoral Care and Mercy will be determined by the Senior Minister in conjunction with the elders and the Assistant Minister based on the needs of the church and the gifting, interests and competencies of the appointee.

As one of the leaders of CCS, the Assistant Minister is expected to undertake his ministry as per the requirements and expectations of elders in Acts 20 and the Pastoral Epistles, and as CCS is an AMiE (Anglican Mission in England) founding church, the appointee will need to be willing to serve in an episcopal context, and be in agreement with the GAFCON Jerusalem Statement and Declaration.

The closing date for applications is 15th May, 2021, with a start date of 1st Sep 2021.
