We know that starting new churches brings uncertainty. Will anyone be interested? Will we find a venue? Will there be enough money? Will anyone become a Christian?

However, we are guaranteed that God is powerful and abundantly generous, and he will provide everything his people need to carry out the gospel ministry that is in accordance with his will. This truth allows us to confidently embark on the faith-stretching and life-changing adventure of pioneering new churches.

One pioneering individual has recently moved to the North West to begin to gather people to launch a new church in the town.
