



Children's Minister

Christ Church Balham, a thriving Anglican evangelical church located on the Northern Line in south-west London, is seeking to appoint a Children's Ministry Lead. Our fellowship is made up of largely families and young workers, with a vision is to see Balham and beyond thriving in Christ. Our mission is to invite everyone to come and see the depth of Christ's love with the breadth of God's family. Over the past three years the number of children in the church family has grown from 30 to 70, and we now have around 70 volunteers serving across our five Sunday children's teams. We are now looking for the right person to lead the Children's ministry with a view to:

- Partner with parents in the discipleship of their children
- Set, implement and maintain the vision and strategy
- Resource the children's work with faithful and high-quality materials
- Recruit, disciple and train volunteers to deliver fruitful children's ministry for God's glory
- Identify evangelistic opportunities (such as local school partnerships or holiday clubs)
- Personally teach and disciple specific age groups during Sunday services

This is a permanent, full-time position structured over 5 days per week. We will provide an appropriate basic salary based on experience, expected to be in the range of £31,000-40,000 gross per annum, a generous pension contribution of 10% of the basic salary into our workplace pension scheme and annual leave of 6 weeks and bank holidays. Opportunities for training include costs covered to attend one residential conference specific to the role each year. Depending on experience and interest, a variety of further training options may be available, such as courses at Oak Hill, Crosslands, or GYD Academy. There is also the option of a route for ordination with the Anglican Mission in England.
